eCycling Stats

- Represents a rapidly growing waste stream.
- Technological advances are rapidly rendering formerly cuttingedge electronics obsolete.
- An estimated 20 million personal computers became obsolete in 1998.
- In 2005, more than 63 million personal computers are projected to be retired according to a recent study by the National Safety Council.
- Most of these are in storage. Of the remainder, the bulk were disposed of; probably fewer than 6 percent were recycled.
- Currently the useful life of a computer is only 3 to 5 years and shrinking.
